PASTOR'S PEN

Trust & Obey

Trust and Obey; it's the title of a well-known hymn that you've probably sung many times over the years. It's a simple title with just two main words. They are understandable words, everyday words. However, these two words call you to perform the most challenging task. That makes me ponder the reason behind the difficulty. This hymn is easy to sing ... "trust and obey for there's no other way, to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey." But, actually trusting, and truly obeying, are way more complicated than just singing.

When you look at the verses to this traditional hymn, you see four avenues for growing in your ability to Trust and Obey. First, you must understand the Lord's way is the best way. When you walk in His way God walks with you, He abides with you, and you receive blessings. The world longs for you to turn from the Lord's guidance and seek a different path. But this path only leads to destruction. Second, when you follow God's way, it will lead you to action. You will find that God's call includes kingdom work for you to accomplish. This work may be difficult. It may cost you a lot of money or time or sleepless nights. But working for the kingdom also brings joy, satisfaction, and peace. God has promised you that He will bless your work. Third, is commitment. You must be whole-heartedly committed to the kingdom. You cannot serve two masters. God must be first in your life, and you must be willing to lay all at His feet. Lastly, you must know that this is only possible because God loves you. Without a clear understanding of God's love, everything will be burdensome. But the last thing in the world the hymn Trust and Obey expresses to us is the idea of burden. The chorus declares the opposite ... "trust and obey for there's no other way, to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey.

Happiness in the Christian walk begins by trusting God and then obeying His commands. In Jeremiah 17:7-8, we read, "Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord. 8 He is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit." You may think that trusting in the Lord, giving your all to the Lord, and believing that the Lord's way is the best leads to hard work, heartache, and disappointment. But the Lord's promises never fail and when the day of trouble comes those who have their roots planted near the stream of God's living water will flourish despite adversity.

Are there areas in your life this year where you have had to face adversity, doubts, or fears? When those times come, it can be easy to think that the simple hymn title Trust and Obey is only a reminder that we should be good Christians. But its more profound than that. When the hymn-writer speaks of Trust and Obey, he writes about the confidence we can have in the promises of God. God provided you His only Son so that you could have salvation. God provided you His only Son so that you could be redeemed and made an heir of the kingdom. Since God has given you so "rich a salvation," you can whole-heartedly trust Him, you can willingly obey Him. And when you do, you will find that during the dry times, you will still be able to bear fruit. Trust and Obey for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus but to Trust and Obey.
