PASTOR'S PEN

Communion In Christ

As I preach through Ephesians, the theme of being 'In Christ' will serve as our foundation. As we learned in chapter 1, every spiritual blessing is delivered to us through Him. Nowhere is this truer than when we celebrate the Lord's Supper. When you come to the Lord's Table as a believer, you celebrate your union with Jesus in the deepest possible way.

In 1 Corinthians 15:1-4, Paul sets out the gospel message as he writes. "Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, **2** and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. **3** For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, **4** that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures." The very grounds of the union you celebrate at the Lord's Table are the death and resurrection of your Savior. The death of Jesus reminds us of our need, while the resurrection points us to the goal of our new life, 'In Christ.'

Each of us stands guilty before a Holy God and therefore subject to the just punishment of eternal separation from Him. Your need was so great that only the death of the eternal Son of God could satisfy your debt. And Jesus did make satisfaction for you. At the cross, God Almighty laid your iniquities on Him. The cup is a reminder that the blood of Jesus made atonement for your sins. The bread we eat testifies to the body of Jesus given for you – to make you holy. Paul says this is a message of first importance. For without the death and resurrection of Jesus, we would be without hope.

But Jesus did die for you. The Son of God was raised from the dead! The first part brings you salvation, and the second verifies its effectiveness. The Lord's supper is a celebration of fellowship with God. As Dr. Howard Griffith wrote, "The Lord's Supper seals the sacrifice, once offered on the cross, to believers. The Supper is the meal of the fellowship of blessing with God, achieved by Jesus' blood-shedding. Its focus is not "elements" of bread and wine, but Jesus' death for us, which they show."

This fellowship of blessing declares that when you are 'In Christ,' you have all the benefits that Paul mentions in Ephesians. You are chosen, redeemed, forgiven, made holy and blameless, adopted into the family of God, and sealed with the Holy Spirit as you wait to acquire possession of your inheritance. Paraphrasing The Belgic confession, "This feast is a spiritual table, at which Christ communicates himself with all his benefits to us so that we can enjoy both himself and the merits of his sufferings and death: nourishing, strengthening, and comforting our poor comfortless souls with these elements."

The Lord's Table unites blessing, fellowship, forgiveness, and salvation. When you partake of the Sacrament, you are fed a tangible reminder that you are 'In Christ.' Allow the Sacrament to be a blessing by feeding on Jesus and understanding all that it means to be made holy In Him!
