PASTOR'S PEN

Basic Facts

Your mind is a beautiful thing created by a loving God. Your brain contains billions of nerve cells coordinating thought, emotion, behavior, movement, and sensation. Not only does it coordinate the functions of your body, but it also stores vast amounts of information. Think about all the memories you have, all of the knowledge about life. You know how to brush your teeth, care for children, drive, cook, eat, and hopefully tie your shoes. You've learned all these things because they were essential and needful. And even though some of us are older than others, we've all learned to use VCRs, smartphones, and the internet. My point? It's never too late to learn or re-learn the basic facts about the gospel. And your brain is not too old either.

Here are some basic facts you should know—the order of the 66 books of the bible. You should at least know where to start looking for them. You should be able to trace the storyline of God's work of redemption found in the bible - the significant events from creation to the second coming of Christ. I know that sounds daunting, but you can learn a basic outline. Include creation, the fall, the flood, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, David, the divided kingdom, the exile, the return, the life of Jesus, Pentecost, the ingrafting of the Gentiles, and the return of Christ.

Memorize the Ten Commandments – in Order! Start with the basics and then memorize the entire commandment as given to us in Exodus 20. Next, study what's called the Romans Road to Salvation. These are five verses in the book of Romans that help us walk through and understand our need for a Savior and what we receive through God's provision of Christ (3:10; 3:23; 5:8; 6:23; 10:9). Mark these in your bible so you can use them to share the gospel and lead someone to Christ.

You should know some other scriptures: John 3:16; 1 John 1:9; Ephesians 2:8-10. I won't write John 3:16 here; you probably know that one already. 1 John 1:9 reads, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." This is a great reminder when temptations lead to sin, and you need true repentance. You can be sure that when you repent, God will forgive.

Memorize Ephesians 2:8-10 which reads, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." This is the heart of the gospel message. God saved you by grace, not by any works you've done, but as a gift you didn't deserve.

Now that you've begun to exercise your brain, here's a little theology for you. Five Solas describe what we believe as Christians (sola means alone). They can be condensed into two statements. We believe Scripture alone is the final authority. We believe that Salvation comes by God's grace alone, through Christ alone, by faith alone to God's glory alone.

Your mind is a beautiful organ created by a loving God. Use it to glorify Him by learning just how much He loves you.
