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# PASTOR'S PEN

#### Living in a Real World

If you aren't aware, I record a daily devotion on various biblical topics Monday through Saturday. For the last two weeks and the next five weeks we'll be working through some of the emotions we find the Psalmist dealing with. We are created as emotional beings. This means that emotions are part of our experience. That doesn't mean we each deal with or express our emotions similarly, but we each do have emotions. When life's difficulties press us, those emotions will show up.

These devotions try to point out that our God-given emotions are meant to help us navigate the world in a godly way. Whether it's fear or gladness, guilt or sadness, each emotion is intended to point out something about your situation and then push you toward God as your all-sufficient Lord and Savior.

Take fear, for example, in Psalm 23, David is a sheep, vulnerable to attack, needy, and lost apart from the Shepherd. Yet, as he thinks about his situation, he realizes God is the Good Shepherd. He cares for David's every need. Food, water, rest, direction, and protection are all given under the careful watch of the Good Shepherd. In Psalm 23, there is more than simple protection, too. There is a personal relationship with the Shepherd. He is not far off making sure someone else gets the work done. Instead, David says that the Shepherd is with him. No matter what happens, David is confident that he will have blessings in life and death. David knows that he will dwell with the Lord forever. And this calms his fear.

Fear is a God-given emotion that protects us from danger. The problem arises when you allow the world to distort fear. When that happens, fear can turn to anxiety and an overwhelming dread of the future. The Psalmist helps us deal wisely with fear of the future by reminding us that everyone who trusts in the Lord is secure in Him.

Over the next five weeks, we'll explore a range of emotions, including anger, hurt, joy, and guilt. Last week, we delved into the topic of loneliness. If you haven't had a chance to listen to it, I encourage you to do so on the church website, especially if you've ever experienced loneliness. This week, we'll focus on sadness, an emotion that often signals loss, change, or unfulfilled desires.

Have you ever felt sad? We all have. Whether it's not getting chosen for the school football team or facing the loss of a loved one, sadness can be overwhelming when we allow the world to distort the purpose God intends for this emotion. I encourage everyone to listen to the daily devotion. If you can't, then at least read through the Psalms. When you find sadness in the words of the Psalmist – see how they dealt with their emotions (Psalm 42). Look for the godly principle behind their reaction. Allow God to use their experience to draw you to Himself. And learn how to deal with your emotions in a way that glorifies God and encourages you!
