# PASTOR'S PEN

#### The Greatest Gift

Christmas is coming. It's just around the corner! Another year has gone by, and we're already celebrating the first week of Advent. Christmas is an excellent time of year. Children love to think about presents, Christmas trees, cookies, decorations, and ... presents! For the average person, and especially for the church, December is a hectic yet satisfying month. For the followers of Jesus, it's a time meant to remind us of the birth of Christ, that moment in history when our Savior was born. It was the greatest gift God could ever give us.

The gospel of John doesn't tell of the birth of Jesus. Yet, the gospel of John does invite us to marvel at the coming of Jesus. In the opening verses of the first chapter of the Gospel of John, the Apostle declares who Jesus is – "God come in the flesh to tabernacle with us." That's what makes the Christmas story so fantastic, incredible, and life-changing.

John 1:1-4 reads, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."

John tells us who Jesus is. He reveals that Jesus is God, the second person of the Trinity. He is eternal.

John 1:14 goes on to say, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." I don't know what's on your Christmas wish list this year, but I do know that when Jesus was born, it truly was the greatest gift God could ever give you!

May this Advent season remind you of who Jesus is, what He came to do, and what you receive through Him.
